We had another great summer working with a team of youth for four weeks this past summer. This year brought us to Canada to work with Open Air Campaigners evangelists Greg Barclay and Chip Welton in Calgary, Edmonton, and Vancouver. It was great to preach the Gospel to a wide range of people from many different cultures, as the




world is in both Calgary and Vancouver. We began our time working with a church plant doing two VBS programs each day outdoors in communities surrounding the building in which the church met. It was amazing to see the kids God brought to the club as it grew during the week. We had kids from Vietnam, Lebanon, Iraq, and various nations in Africa. Some were Muslims and we were able to share about the only true God of Holy Scripture, (Father, Son, and Holy Spirit) and the good news of the Gospel. It was amazing to see some of the kids express faith in Jesus. Two Muslim kids stuck out. I remember asking one of them named Leida why she wanted to trust in Jesus? Her answer, "Because I believe He died on the cross..." I ask her if it was going to be OK for her to bring a Bible home to her house to which she responded, "yes." I certainly hope so. Please pray for Leida that she would continue in the faith. It is God who will ultimately keep someone no matter what reaction of his or her family. All the kids were invited to the church and door-to-door ministry is a regular part of their outreach. It was a pleasure to meet a couple in the church who was saved through knocking on doors.


A WORD FROM THE MRS.



Do you remember me? It is Karen." "And I said, Of course I remember you." There she was all grown up and with a little baby girl in the car. She explained that the weekly Bible Club had been a blessing to her life and that she was now serving in church on a regular basis. She explained that another child (now a man) David from the club (who had been a bit of a trouble maker) was attending the same church and was serving as part of the visitation team. Praise to God for allowing me to see some fruit from sowing the seed of the Gospel in Langley Park over the years.

College Ministry

I just returned from preaching on four different college campuses in Virginia, North Carolina and Tennessee. While on the University of Tennessee, Knoxville campus, we put the question on the sketchboard "ARE YOU GOING TO HEAVEN?' A student named Blick approached me and explained that he had been a Christian and that he was going to hell. When I pressed him on why he thought that way, he explained that he had been sleeping around and partying hard. I encouraged him as Apostle Paul wrote, "examine yourself to see whether or not you are in the faith." He responded, "That is just it; I do not feel bad about what I'm doing" to which I replied, "Then why are you standing here talking to me?" Thinking about that he said, "Do you think God would take me back?" I pulled up the story of the prodical son on my phone and read it to him, and said "Where do you see yourself in the story?" I said to him, "If you are indeed a child of God then the Father is just like the father in the story. He is ready to receive you back, have a party, kill the fatted calf, put a robe on your back and a ring on your finger."
