
HAPPY NEW YEAR!

Angela and I want to thank you for your support through prayer and finance. We are very grateful to God for all of you and are continually encouraged by you. This morning as I started writing this newsletter, I took a glance at how the Apostle Paul ended some of his epistles. This is how he ended his letter to the Ephesians, "Peace be to the brothers and sisters and love with faith, from God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. Grace be with all who love our Lord Jesus Christ with love incorruptible." (Ephesians 6:23-24) Only those, "born from above" fully appreciate the divine grace given by God the Father through His Son. By the power of the Holy Spirit, we can experience true peace, faith, and love. Just read Romans 5. Only because of what God has done are we able to go into the world which is against our Lord, (Psalm 2 and Acts 4) who offers true peace, faith, love and hope. As a believer, I have true hope which can be defined simply as a "confident expectation." I am confident in the works of Christ - His death, burial, resurrection, and His return. While at North Idaho College, I get to work alongside an on-campus student-led Christian club, "Campus Alive in Christ." What a joy it is to work with these young believers. Each Monday from 11:00 - 2:00, we set up the sketchboard and have a table offering Gospel tracts, Bibles, and other Christian materials. Items on the table include wrist bands. One of the words on the bands is "HOPE." I'm amazed at how many of the students stop to pick up things from table. As they pick up the bands, they read the words, sometimes out loud, and as they read the word, "HOPE" I ask them, "Do you have hope?", which leads to a conversation about Jesus. One day, a group of four students stopped by to look through the materials on the table, and one of them did just that. When I asked, "Do you have hope?", she had a puzzled look, and answered, "I hope so." I then asked, "What, or who, is your hope in?" "Myself" was her answer, which is a common one. Long story short, we had a great conversation about how we, and the people around us, are limited, but Jesus, the Christ, is unlimited and offers a depth of hope that only He can give. The hope that is in the Gospel of Christ (Colossians 1:23). Throughout the conversation, the other three students remained silent, yet when they left, all of them took tracts and materials, including a Bible.

Fellow saints, listen to what the Lord says in 1 Peter:

But even if you should suffer for righteousness' sake, you will be blessed. Have no fear of them, nor be troubled, but in your hearts honor Christ the Lord as holy, always being prepared to make a defense to anyone who asks you for a reason for the hope that is in you; yet do it with gentleness and respect, having a good conscience. 1 Peter 3:14-16(a)

Earlier, I made reference to Psalm 2 and Acts 4. I encourage you to read these passages, for the world is against the Lord; who He is, His Word, and what He offers, yet we see in Acts 4:29 that the church prayed for boldness to speak His word. Let us pray for one another that we would have boldness to speak the truth of the Gospel, offering hope that is only found in Christ.

I ask that you pray for Arless, who stopped to solve the Riddle while I was at the Spokane Transit Station. When we got to the part of the Riddle where I ask, "Where will you end up when you die?" Arless got a downcast look but answered, "Heaven." I asked him, "Why do you think you'll go to heaven?" And Arless answered, "Because Jesus died for my sins." Arless gave the right answer, but there seemed something out of place

for Arless. A lengthy conversation and sharing of Scripture ensued, till, finally, I questioned Arless point blank on some issues, and yes, Arless had fallen into sin that was seriously affecting his relationship with Christ. We prayed and read Scripture together. Pray Arless will repent and forsake his sin, continuing in a peaceful walk with Christ.

I am always looking for ways to draw people in order to share the Gospel. This year, I am working with our mules, Parker and Briscoe, to enable us to take them to community events to help draw attention to the sketchboard, which I hope to be able to hang off Parker, our big mule. My plan is to be able to do the Gospel presentation on the sketchboard while it's hanging on him! In addition, there are plenty of parades where we can use both mules displaying Scripture on their packs. Again this year, I ended up with an opportunity to preach for a Cowboy Church at Mule Mania in Dayton, WA.
